NAIDOC Week

At Wilston Kids Care, we are celebrating NAIDOC Week with a range of immersive and respectful activities inspired by our First Nations people.

NAIDOC week begins with the children creating their own Mimih spirit clapping sticks and artworks. Aboriginal rock painting of Mimi spirits can be found dating back as far as 50,000 years ago in the Nourlangie Rock in Arnhem Land or Kakadu in the Northern Territory of Australia.

On Tuesday, we will be embarking on a paper craft that allows children to interpret examples of Indigenous art and create their own masterpiece. The children can take on inspiration from various indigenous art styles such as cross hatching, dot painting, ocre, bush medicine leaves, colour fields and many more.

Wednesday is the day for our Junior NAIDOC Week colouring in competition whilst the senior school will be doing nature watercolour painting. Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples view themselves as living components required by the environment, and dependent on other living things, for the environment to thrive. The nature watercolour experience pays homage to this view and belief of our First Nations people.

On Thursday, the children will be creating Aboriginal flags using paddle pop sticks and paint in the sacred colours of yellow, black and red. The colours on the Aboriginal flag are symbolised by the earth (red), aboriginal people (black) and the sun (yellow).

Friday will round the week off with a variety of Yulunga games that will keep the children active and engaged whilst celebrating NAIDOC Week. In the language of the Kamilaroi (Gamori) people of North-West New South Wales, Yulunga means "playing".

This included an interactive presentation regarding how to identify waste, how to execute waste reduction and how to identify different types of waste and where they go and to wrap things up in an exciting relay race game.
